World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates

As of August 12, 2019

- The outlook for U.S. 2019/20 wheat this month is for greater supplies, increased use and higher ending stocks.
- U.S. wheat production is raised 59 million bushels to 1,980 million on increased winter wheat and other spring wheat production as indicated by the NASS August Report.
- Foreign 2019/20 wheat supplies are reduced 4.5 million tons, primarily on lower production in several major competing exporters.
- Projected 2019/20 global exports are down 0.5 million tons.
- With supplies falling more than use, global ending stocks are revised 1.1 million tons lower to 285.4 million tons, but **remain record large**.

South Dakota Wheat Stocks

As of June 28, 2019

- Total stocks: 39,100,000 bushels (+50% from 2018)
- On-farm stocks: 17,000,000 bushels (+85% from 2018)
- Off-farm stocks: 22,100,000 bushels (+31% from 2018)

2019 South Dakota Winter Wheat

As of July 11, 2019

- 850,000 acres planted (+2% from 2018)
- 730,000 acres harvested forecast (+11% from 2018)
- 86% of planted acres harvest forecast (+5% from 2018)
- 39.4 million bushels forecast (+24% from 2018)
- 54 bushels/acre forecast (+ 6 bpa from 2018)

2019 South Dakota Spring Wheat

As of July 11, 2019

- 800,000 acres planted (-24% from 2018) **RECORD LOW**
- 770,000 acres harvested forecast (-20% from 2018)
- 96% of planted acres
- 37.0 million bushels forecast (-9% from 2018)
- 48 bushels/acre forecast (+ 6 bpa from 2018)
