## ★ World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates

As of September 12, 2019

- The 2019/20 U.S. wheat supply and demand outlook is unchanged this month but there were offsetting by-class changes for wheat exports.
- The global outlook for wheat this month is for lower supplies, reduced consumption and exports, and higher ending stocks.
- The reduction in global production is tempered by higher carry-in stocks, which results in global supplies less than 1 million tons lower this month.
- Despite a reduction this month in global supplies, 2019/20 ending stocks are projected **record large** at 286.5 million tons with China comprising 51% of the total.

## South Dakota Wheat Stocks

As of June 28, 2019

- Total stocks: 39,100,000 bushels (+50% from 2018)
- On-farm stocks: 17,000,000 bushels (+85% from 2018)
- Off-farm stocks: 22,100,000 bushels (+31% from 2018)

## 2019 South Dakota Winter Wheat

As of July 11, 2019

- 850,000 acres planted (+2% from 2018)
- 730,000 acres harvested forecast (+11% from 2018)
- 86% of planted acres harvest forecast (+5% from 2018)
- 39.4 million bushels forecast (+24% from 2018)
- 54 bushels/acre forecast (+ 6 bpa from 2018)

## 2019 South Dakota Spring Wheat

As of July 11, 2019

- 800,000 acres planted (-24% from 2018) **RECORD LOW**
- 770,000 acres harvested forecast (-20% from 2018)
- 96% of planted acres
- 37.0 million bushels forecast (-9% from 2018)
- 48 bushels/acre forecast (+ 6 bpa from 2018)
