★ World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates

As of September 11, 2020

- The 2020/21 U.S. wheat supply and demand outlook is unchanged this month but there are offsetting by-class changes for wheat exports.
- The 2020/21 global wheat outlook is for larger supplies, increased consumption, greater exports, and higher stocks.
- World consumption is increased 0.8 million tons to 750.9 million, primarily on higher feed and residual usage for Australia and Canada.
- Projected 2020/21 world ending stocks are increased 2.6 million tons to 319.4 million to a **NEW RECORD**, with China and India accounting for 51 and 10 percent of the total respectively.

South Dakota Wheat Stocks

As of June 30, 2020

- Total stocks: 45.8 million bushels (+17% from 2019)
- On-farm stocks: 18.0 million bushels (+6% from 2019)
- Off-farm stocks: 27.8 million bushels (+26% from 2019)

2020 South Dakota Winter Wheat

As of August 12, 2020

- 650,000 acres planted (-24% from 2019)
- 580,000 acres est. harvested (-25% from 2019)
- 89% of planted acres est. harvested
- 34.8 million bushels harvested est. (-13% from 2019)
- 60 bushels per acre est. (+8 from 2019)

2020 South Dakota Spring Wheat

As of August 12, 2020

- 850,000 acres planted forecast (+33% from 2019)
- 815,000 acres est. harvested (+35% from 2019)
- 96% of planted acres est. harvested
- 36.7 million bushels est. harvested (+41% from 2019)
- 45 bushels/acre est. (+2 bpa from 2019)
