South Dakota Wheat Stocks

As of September 30, 2021

- Total stocks: 59.2 million bushels (-31% from 2020)
- On-farm stocks: 25.5 million bushels (-39% from 2020)
- Off-farm stocks: 33.7 million bushels (-23% from 2020)

2021 South Dakota Winter Wheat

As of September 30, 2021

- 800,000 acres est. planted (+27% from 2020)
- 720,000 acres est. harvested (+20% from 2020)
- 90% of planted acres harvested (+3% from 2020)
- 27.4 million bushels est. harvested (-21% from 2020)
- 38 bushels per acre est. (-20 from 2020)

2021 South Dakota Spring Wheat

As of September 30, 2021

- 720,000 acres est. planted (-6% from 2020)
- 590,000 acres est. harvested (-22% from 2020)
- 82% of planted acres harvested (-14% from 2020)
- 17.1 million bushels est. harvested (-52% from 2020)
- 29 bushels/acre est. (-18 bpa from 2020)

★ World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates

As of November 9, 2021

- The outlook for 2021/22 U.S. wheat this month is for lower supplies, higher domestic use, reduced exports, and slightly higher ending stocks.
- The global wheat outlook for 2021/22 is for reduced supplies, slightly higher consumption, increased trade, and lower ending stocks.
- World consumption is raised 0.4 million tons to 787.2 million.
- Projected global ending stocks are down 1.4 million tons to 275.8 million, with Australia, the EU, and India accounting for most of the reduction.
